

# HOW TO READ THE LESSON TIMETABLE

1. **PLACES:** There are three places where the lessons are held: “Polo Carmignani”, “Polo Piagge” and “Palazzo della Sapienza”.

The first one is in Cavalieri’s Square 8, behind the “Scuola Normale Superiore”.



Instead, the second one is in Giacomo Matteotti Street 11, near “Palazzo dei Congressi”.



The last one is in Curtatone and Montanara Street 15.



2. **CLASSROOMS:** On the top of the lesson timetable, you can find a legend which show you the classrooms where the lessons take place. PAM, P1, P2 and P ¾ are the classrooms in Polo Carmignani. A1, B1, C1, D1, E1, L1, M1, N1, O1, PP1 (**ATTENTION!** There's a double P) and Q1 are the classroom in Polo Piagge. SapI, SapII, SapIII, SapIV, SapV and SapVI are the classrooms in Palazzo della Sapienza.
3. **TIME and DAY:** To understand, we can do an example.

In the lesson timetable of this semester, the first lesson of the first year is Diritto costituzionale I.

- On the left, you find a “A” which means the course you are part of. Some courses are divided in A, B and C. Those whose first surname goes from the letter A to the letter C are in the course A. Those whose first surname goes from the letter D to the letter M are in the course B. Those whose first surname goes from the letter N to the letter Z are in the course C. Other courses are divided only in A and B. Those whose first surname goes from the letter A to the letter L are in the course A and those whose first surname goes from the letter M to the letter Z are in the course B.

- On the left, you find also the number of hours of the course. In the example, there are 72 hours.
- On the right, you read “8.45\*2” and “P2”, that are respectively time, duration and classroom. “8.45” means that the lesson start at a quarter to 9 a.m. “\*2” means that the lesson will last two hours. Indeed, the lessons generally finishes a half hour before to let you take the next course, that normally starts at 10.30 a.m.
- At last, the days of lessons are only the days under which you can find time and classroom. In the example, the days are Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. So, if you don’t read anything under a day, it means that there isn’t a lesson in that day.

## **ACADEMIC CALENDAR**

- **LESSONS:** The lessons start on September 17th.

**First semester:** From September 17th to December 14th, 2018.

Christmas holidays: From December 24th to January 6th, 2019.

**Second semester:** From February 18th to May 17th, 2019.

Easter holidays: From the 19th to the 23th of April 2019.

- **EXAM SESSION:**

**First semester:** 3 exam sessions:

From the 17th to the 21th of December, 2018 (1 session);

From the 20th to the 31th of May 2019 (1 session);
